

EXECUTIVE REPORTS

President Neil Wuolle

Welcome to the 52nd Annual General Meeting. In the past 12 months a lot has happened, beginning with the discovery of financial irregularities following last year's Provincial Championships in Abbotsford. The Board moved quickly to protect the organization, determine what happened, and what recourse there was. Over the past 12 months, our Executive Director's employment has been terminated, the police have been consulted and a civil action has been initiated. The BCSSA remains financially healthy.

On a more positive note, we have established a good working relationship with Swim BC. In a partnership with them, an opportunity has been created for swimmers to give "winter swimming" a try, without putting their "S" status at risk. This fall we begin working with Swim BC to create a way for BCSSA athletes to compete at the next BC Summer Games. We will also explore ways to cut our insurance costs by affiliating with Swimming Canada (through Swim BC).

We have had an initial meeting with the BC Water Polo Association to find ways to work more closely and effectively to benefit athletes (the BCWPA was very helpful in helping us with officiating for this championship!).

The BCSSA has also partnered with Liam Donnelly, Head Coach of SFU Clan Swimming and Diving to produce the 2011 BC Summer Swimming Association Spring Summit. This huge, exciting venture will focus on the needs of all BCSSA members. Information and registration can be found on the SFU Aquatics web page; <u>www.simonfraseraquatics.com</u>.

I would like to welcome Michael Hutchinson, our new office administrator, to the BCSSA. Michael brings a background of swimming with the BCSSA, is a technical guru with timing systems, and has experience in office systems. Other changes around the office include a new website. Look it over and bookmark it; <u>http://www.bcsummerswimming.com/index.html</u>. Thank you to the Web Committee for getting this project off the ground. If you see a way to improve the site please let the office know.

Each year the composition of the Board of Directors changes slightly with a few members retiring, and new volunteers taking their places. To those members departing the Board this year, I wish to thank you! Thank you for the commitment of time, energy and caring. As president, it is my job to tap people on the shoulder, and ask them to take on one more job or project. I am very appreciative to the "Yes, I will" responses and the skills you have brought to us. Through-out the province, people give their time and energy to keep clubs and Regions functioning.

Vice President Danny Schilds

After a tumultuous start, the past year has turned out to be very productive. The departure of our former Executive Director left several holes, not only in staffing the office but also missing documents and tapes. At last year's AGM the meeting voted to reduce the size of the Board of Directors and redefined several of the positions on the board. Unfortunately, one of the documents that went missing was the minutes of that meeting. Without proper minutes it is impossible to submit changes to our Rules and Regulations. This past winter the Board was able to put together what we believe is an accurate account of the 2009 AGM and those minutes will be up for approval at the 2010 AGM. Upon approval, we will then be able to file changes approved last year.

In addition to last year's reduction in the Board size, this year you will be asked to vote on combining the positions of Marketing and Member services into one position, Director of Member Services. With approval of this change, the BCSSA will have reduced its board size from 22 down to 19. I feel that any further reductions would be difficult and if the membership wants a smaller Board to save on expenses then we will next have to either look at how to accommodate representation for Diving, Synchro, Water polo, and Coaches and look at combining some of those positions or possibly look at an Executive Board that meets regularly and a full board that meets less often. Having said that, I think the membership should be pleased at the efforts that the current board has made to keep expenses as low as possible.

This past year saw the introduction of new rules for all four aquatic sports. Synchro is doing a one year trial with new age grouping, our suit rules now follow the late lead of FINA, and after requests from coaches and officials, the rules of swimming are now aligned closer to FINA rules than they have been for more than 35 years. (At one time we did swim completely under FINA rules and our officials only had a FINA rule book, there was not a BCSSA rule book) As always with new rules there are growing pains but I think overall the new rules have worked well for the organization. As with any document, our rules are changeable so if we find things that don't work, we can change them. Depending on finances, I do hope to print new rule book inserts this winter so we can do away with our notes and scratches in the columns of our well worn old books.

Last October, the Board voted to allow BCSSA 'S" swimmers to take part in SNC/Swim BC meets as long as the swimmer followed the two hour rule. In April the Board voted to extend that ruling for the coming winter season so our swimmers that desire it can try out a winter meet. Our relationship with Swim BC has been a very positive experience these past two years and we are looking forward to more cooperative ventures with them.

In conclusion, I think if the membership had been able to watch their board in action this past year, a very difficult year, and saw the professionalism displayed on behalf of our organization and the efforts and extra-ordinary efforts expended on behalf of the membership and ultimately for our children, you would all be proud.

I would also like to take this time to apologize again to Mr. Stephen Ho, CA, on behalf of the BCSSA as he had no association or connection with the report that was presented at last year's AGM. Therefore, the following report will serve as the official Treasurer's report for the periods ending March 31, 2009 and March 31, 2010.

I will begin with the negative; due to the irregularities in the accounting records for 2009, and the start of 2010, it was decided by the Board to completely redo the bookkeeping from April 2008 to the current date. Luckily we were able to hire an extremely competent management accountant, whom most of you know from the BCSSA, Darcy Morris. With Darcy's knowledge of the BCSSA and assistance from many others, he was able to reconstruct most of the records. We feel we are presenting to the members an accurate representation of the revenue, expenditures and financial position of the provincial organization. Once the records for 2009 and 2010 were reconstructed there was a significant amount of Office expenditures that could not be substantiated; we have disclosed them on the annual financial statements as Office Unrecovered. The amount for 2009 is \$16,473 and the amount for 2010 is \$40,646.

Now for the positive; due to the continuing financial losses the Board has been working hard to reduce costs associated with running an organization the size of the BCSSA, while still providing good service to members and ensuring representation from around the province and the disciplines. These reductions have helped the organization from showing a deficit in 2008 of \$79,422 to a deficit of \$31,650 for 2009 to a surplus for 2010 of \$8,695. You and your Board members should all be congratulated for making changes and looking out for the long term interest of the organization.

Some of the changes that have been made are as follows:

- Reducing the number of face to face Board meetings. The Board is using technology for as many committee meetings as possible as well reducing one complete face to face for the Board as a whole. Although none of us feel that this is as good as face to face meeting, we have been able to keep the organization moving forward.
- 2) Bringing the review of our financial records internal. The Board felt that by having an internal peer review completed on the financial records, with people who understood

our organization and understood bookkeeping procedures we could save some funds and get additional confidence that the records being prepared and presented were accurate. This peer review was selected by the Regional Directors and approved by the Board from members. It is not in an executive position in the provincial Board. I personally thank those members who allowed their names to stand and those who actually completed the review. I work with many non-profit organizations that use this method of reviewing their annual accounting, and with your help in preparing a procedure list, it will make the work load of future members much less.

- 3) Bringing down the costs of holding the Provincial Championship. With the guidance of Tony Tsang and the members of the last two provincial organizing committees, we have worked hard to keep reducing the costs of operating one of the largest aquatic competitions in Canada. (I also know that the Board for this year's 2010 championship has also been working hard to keep up with this trend.) The Board recognizes that in some years it will be impossible to maintain the reductions, but everyone is cost conscious and are doing everything they can to keep costs as low as possible, while still providing a championship venue and event.
- 4) Salaries and administration costs are a continuing discussion point at the Board level. After the 2009 provincial Championship, the Executive Director's position was vacated and has not been filled. To offset the reduction in service at the office level we contracted with Darcy (as mentioned above) to do some bookkeeping and administrative functions: as well, each one of the Board members has had to take a more active role in making sure the needs of the members are being met. As we started into our busy season for 2010, it was decided to hire a summer office assistant and the Board will be evaluating the ongoing needs for this position in the near future.
- 5) Using Technology to communicate with the members. As some of you may remember the newsletter used to be printed and mailed out to all the members, this was a substantial cost and the Board felt that with the WEB we could still get the information out using the WEB site.

Some other items to note are as follows:

- Direct Access Funding. During 2008 we were not able to get any direct access funding due to the financial position of the organization. Some changes were made and in 2009 \$20,000 was received, but in 2010 the reduction in funds available dropped and the association only received \$6,391.
- 2) The Board, with advice from Legal counsel, will continue attempts to recover "Office Unrecovered" funds through the courts.

Having said that, the card meet remains a vital part of summer swim meets and will remain as an option to clubs.

I must acknowledge and thank the tremendous efforts of Stephanie Christie and Mike Girard of Fraser South and Sean Cauley of Simon Fraser Regions in drafting up the methods in "Determining Official Timing Results" and Trudy Kemper and Danny Schilds for reviewing it.

Well, the 2009-2010 season is about to close and I say this every year, "Wow, did the season go fast!"

I am re-working the Officials handbook and it is a work in progress. Once finished, it will be included on the 2010-2011 Resource disks, along with some new resources that have come out in the last few months and years.

We as an Officials' Committee held a "face to face" meeting in November, which every Regional Director of Officials attended. We thoroughly reviewed the Stroke and Turn DVD that Carl Cooper had prepared a couple years ago. We came to a consensus as a group how we were going to call the varying degrees of infractions, especially in the backstroke and breaststroke. This was just a small step to trying to ensure "uniformity" across the province. I also relaunched the yellow certification card to help officials track their progress. This is a great resource to show when crossing over into working winter club swim meets. Although the card needs minor adjustments, I felt as we use up the old stock we could monitor how this resource is embraced and decide at a later date if there is enough interest/need to print an updated version.

The burden of responsibility of time on deck at Provincials was put back on the RDO's. There has been some scrutiny to how I schedule Provincial shifts. Every official must come to their Regional Meet prepared to sign up to work Provincials, for your Regional Director of Officials will be talking to you about your commitment level. If you have visions of advancing up the "pin ladder", you must be having conversations with your own Regional Director of Officials as to what your strategy will be to reach your goals, ultimately early in the swim season, as to give time to work on those goals. I encourage every official to take the Conflict/Resolution Clinic and the Harassment Policy Clinic every year or two, to keep "fresh". I am excited about the new masters' candidates and their enthusiasm to review and solidify their knowledge as they take this next step.

This summer season has brought several challenges. Not surprising, the back stroke turn didn't re-surface, but "stayed afloat" as the most challenged rule in the book. A new suggested wording of the backstroke turn infraction was put forth to the group of RDOs which seemed to help clarify the distinction between "swimming on the front" and a properly executed backstroke turn. The "re-wording" of the rule book for the 2010 season brought controversy in some of the regions. Although our interpretations didn't really change, the absence of certain words in the rule book confused some. In the effort to bring our rules more closely aligned to the FINA rules, some of our more seasoned officials had trouble with the change in the wording. The newer officials seemed to have less trouble embracing the changes. Change takes time and we are moving in the right direction.

I was able to make a visit to a Vancouver & District swim meet this season which I thoroughly enjoyed. I hope to have time and fewer scheduling challenges this next season that will allow more visits to meets outside of my home region.

Some new resources were prepared in regards to Clerk of the Course and to Official Timing to reflect cardless meets. Revised versions were put out later in the season after the original documents were scanned for grammar and process errors. Some of these procedures may very well be incorporated into the rule book at a later date to reflect the movement towards cardless meets. I appreciate the thought and work put into new resources. If you have a resource that you would like to suggest or contribute to our organization, please forward to the office or to me. All new resources should be reviewed and approved by your Provincial Director of Officials and the Rules & Reg Committee.

One of my biggest concerns continues to be the succession or the lack of a succession plan in the replacement of retiring officials throughout the province. Every Regional Director of Officials has been asked to maintain a database to pass on to their successor. Look down the road and envision the replacement of your replacement and spend time with them now.

There are a few regions holding clinics during the winter maintenance season, which is commendable. Most regions usually gear up later in the spring or during the season itself. I would like to suggest that each region explore ways to capitalize on the winter maintenance season and hold more clinics while the kids are in the pool. It is a perfect opportunity to hold Stroke and Turn clinics with live examples in the pool. I realize that for some regions this may not be an option for interclub participation due to the travel time.

Now, I am excited to be back in my own region in Kamloops for Provincials this year. I look forward to working a 50 metre pool and its unique challenges in regards to scheduling of officials' shifts. I would like to extend a HUGE thank-you to our new guy in the office, Michael Hutchinson. He has been an amazing resource and has a keen understanding of many of the inner workings of the running of a meet and summer swimming.

This year the Okanagan once again welcomed the participation of smaller clubs such as Princeton and Lillooet; indeed, we hope those communities continue to support summer swimming and build their numbers. Penticton managed to cobble together a team despite not having a swimming pool in which to train. The new, upgraded Aquatic Centre in Penticton should be ready for next year's summer season which is, of course, a bonus for our region.

In fact, this year there were empty weekends in our swim meet schedule since Penticton couldn't host a meet. What exacerbated that situation was that Golden and Merritt had their meets on the same weekend this summer, which, although done in the past, won't be repeated in the future.

The biggest issue facing our clubs when I became RD at the end of last summer was the lack of government grant monies available. With decisions on government gaming money put off until the end of August, we continue to express our concerns, although we are cautiously optimistic that this much needed financial assistance will be given to our clubs.

The swim meets themselves were generally successful and fun ventures. Our region has done an excellent job over the past few years to ensure that there are enough competent officials to run our meets. With the exception of Golden, all of our meets were cardless, and we continue to tweak some of the little issues that arise in that regard.

New this year for our region is the institution of a Timing Improvement Fee or TIF for all swimmers at our meets. A one-dollar surcharge is levied on each swimmer at each meet: this money is separated from meet fees and collected by our regional treasurer. This money is used to help with the upkeep and purchase of our regional timing equipment. Even though not all clubs use our regional timing equipment (e.g. Kelowna and Penticton have their own systems), every club agreed that the entire region benefits from maintaining our regional timing equipment and, as such, we should *all* put money into that pot.

May your time here in Kamloops be enjoyable and I hope you'll be able to look back fondly on the 2010 BCSSA Provincial Championships.

Vancouver & District Regional Report Kerry Sheppard

Vancouver & District has enjoyed a successful and busy season. Registration was strong; we had a total of 510 registrants (many multidisciplinary), including 486 swimmers, 31 divers, 44 synchronized swimmers, and 109 water polo players.

The Region also welcomed a new member club, as the Vancouver Vipers Water Polo Club enjoyed its inaugural season within the BCSSA.

The Squamish Pirates, Vancouver Vikings, North Vancouver Cruisers, and North Shore Winter Club Marlins hosted successful meets. The Cruisers hosted their second "Hootenanny" at UBC, and the Vikings moved to a new venue, the Vancouver Aquatic Centre, in view of the impending closure of their traditional meet home, Percy Norman Pool.

A coordinated meet schedule with Fraser South resulted in solid attendance across both Regions, ensuring that clubs hosting meets generated positive revenues.

Meet revenues were perhaps more important than ever, as club finances were strained by the severe constriction of gaming grants. Clubs responded by demonstrating innovation and energy in their fundraising initiatives, helping to moderate inevitable registration fee increases. Fee increases do not appear to have resulted in any significant decline in numbers in the Region; indeed, it seems that the "value" of BCSSA activities continues to be recognized by members, both existing and new.

I would like to recognize the hard work of the Regional Executive (Glen Terrillon, Rob Fraser, Scott Macfarlane, and Liz Mallender), and of the Club representatives (Ed Jang, Bruce Tout, Jeff Wong, Laura Smith, Kerry Somerville, Jill Aikens, Larry Chappell, and Kathy Woolverton) who contributed so much to make the season a success.

Section 2.A.3.b in the BCSSA rule book be changed to read:

"Not accumulate more than 2 hours of organized aquatic activity that consists of speed swimming, water polo, or synchronized swimming..."

Change P4 Water-polo Division to a P4/Open Category division for players 18 and under and be gender specific teams. National team selected players would still be disqualified from this division, but Provincial team players, and those who have participated at National selection camps would still be eligible.

P5 water-polo division be reclassified as a 19 and over open category which is open to all players including Provincial and national players. P5 would also be gender specific.

That the numbering system of the Rules and Regulations be changed to reflect the changes made in the last two years.

Part 5 – Board of Directors and Officers #27, "The number of directors shall be nineteen (19).

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Move to reduce the size of the Provincial Board of the BCSSA by one position by merging the Director of Marketing and the Director of Member Services into one position titled Director of Member Services.

Rules and Regulations of the BCSSA, Part 7 - Duties of Officers, Number 47 shall be changed to read:

- 47. The Director of Member Services shall:
 - (a) Co-operate in all matters with the President and all members of the Board;
 - (b) Be responsible for the marketing of the B.C. Summer Swimming Association;
 - (c) Be responsible for the publicity for the Society;
 - (d) Be responsible for the fundraising of the Society:
 - (d) Assure that maximum private and public support is enjoyed by the Society;
 - (e) From time to time undertake such activities which will raise the awareness of Summer Swimming in the eyes of the public;
 - (f) Facilitate the development of programs for clubs, coaches, parents, executive, and general volunteers;
 - (g) Provide a manual for the information and operation of a new club;
 - (h) Identify geographic areas with potential for aquatic expansion and oversee the distribution of the BCSSA information package;
 - (i) Encourage feedback from member clubs in order to evaluate programs and services;
 - (j) Provide assistance and resources related to facilities;
 - (k) Compile a "new member" orientation manual;
 - (l) Act as Editor for the Wavelength *Newsletter*;
- (m) Evaluate the organizational structure of the association.
